THE ROLE

The Procurement Generalist will report directly to the Director of Procurement in the Administration Bureau and be responsible but not limited to the following duties:

- Provide administrative support to the Director of Procurement regarding coordination and compliance with policies and procedures.
- Reviewing and clarifying internal requisitions.
- Obtain price quotes for goods and services, assist in gathering and researching information from vendors.
- Ensuring that all requisition and purchase orders are properly prepared and in compliance with the Procurement Policy Board (PPB) rules.
- Interacting regularly with the staff in the office in an effort to fully understand the nature of the required goods and services being requested.
- Reviewing of micro-purchase agreements to ensure compliance with PPB rules and agency requirements.
- Handle a variety of procurements from start to finish, including but not limited to Requirements Contracts; Small Purchases; and Intergovernmental Purchases.
- Ensure the payments are in accordance with the specifications of the scope of the contract or the purchase order.
- Support negotiations of prices and terms with vendors while demonstrating a high level of customer service in interactions with agency colleagues and potential vendors
- Ensure vendors are notified of authorization to provide goods and services.
- Will attend internal and external meetings and procurement-related events as needed.
- Working closely with the Director's regarding coordination and compliance with policies and procedures.
- Advising department heads on issues relating to the procurement goods and services.
- Resolving procurement or payment issues with vendors.
- Arrange travel arrangements.
- Prepare reports on contract and purchase orders.
- Maintain and manage office records.
- Other duties as assigned.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

1. High school graduation or equivalent and three years of experience in community work or community centered activities in an area related to duties described above; or
2. Education and/or experience which is equivalent to "1" above.

PREFERRED SKILLS

- Previous procurement experience in the methods cited above
- Knowledge of New York City Procurement Policy Board Rules.
- Familiarity with the Financial Management Systems (FMS); Procurement and Sourcing Solution Portal (Passport); Office of Citywide Procurement (OCP); and the Payee Information Portal (PIP)

- Problem solving skills and the ability to work well with others to resolve issues.
- Excellent verbal, written, research and professional interpersonal communication skills.
